



# UMF Members Officially Recognize the Sahrawi Arab Democratic Republic!

## REPUBLIC OF BOSQUNIA CONDEMNED MOROCCO!

The member states of United Micronations Federation (UMF) unanimously voted to officially recognize the Sahrawi Arab Democratic Republic (SADR). Following the decision, the Republic of Bosqunia publicly announced its recognition of the SADR, the legitimate representative of the Sahrawi people, in accordance with the UMF's decision.

The following statement was made by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Bosqunia:



*«The Republic of Bosqunia considers the right to freedom and self-determination as fundamental principles. In this context, recognizing and supporting the sovereignty of the Sahrawi Arab Democratic Republic is both a requirement of international law and a humanitarian responsibility. We also strongly condemn the violations of civil rights and oppressive practices of the Kingdom of Morocco in the Western Sahara territory.»*

*While this historic decision by the UMF was considered an important demonstration of international solidarity at the micro-nation level, the people of Bosqunia also published messages of solidarity with the Sahrawi people on social media and various platforms.*
